## Boar's Head Deli Meat Recalls

- Boar's head has expanded their recall of deli meat products that may contain Listeria monocytogenes.
- The products were produced between May 10, 2024 and July 29, 2024 under the Boar's Head and Old Country brand names.
- These items include meat intending for slicing at retail delis as well as some packaged meat and poultry products sold at retail locations. These products have "sell by" dates ranging from 29-JUL-24 through 17-OCT-24



### **Listeria Outbreak Facts**

- Many people ill from this outbreak have reported eating meats sliced at deli counters.
  - Those with weakened immune systems, are pregnant, or aged 65+ are at higher risk.
    - The CDC recommends that those at higher risk should avoid eating meats sliced at the deli or heat them to an internal temperature of 165°F or until steaming hot before eating.

### Universal Home Visiting

Family Connects NJ is a free, voluntary program offering a visit at home by specially trained nurses for any family caring for a newborn baby. The program is available to all New Jersey families.

During the critical first weeks following childbirth, Family Connects NJ provides families with a private visit at home by a specially trained nurse. Program nurses will check the baby's weight, assess physical and emotional health of both newborn and parents. Family Connects NJ nurses also provide information on important topics like feeding, sleeping, and community resources available, if needed.

#### How to Enroll

Families can learn more information and request a nurse visit by visiting the Family Connects NJ website. For families who would rather enroll by phone, the website also includes phone numbers for local Family Connects NJ nurse providers in your home county.

#### **Program Highlights**

- Care is provided at no cost to you, in the comfort of the family home, and is completely voluntary.
- Services are available to birth, adoptive, and resource families with a newborn, as well as parents experiencing a stillbirth or loss of their newborn.
- Nurse visits are initially open to residents of Essex, Middlesex, Mercer, Cumberland, and Gloucester Counties starting in January 2024.\*
- Specially-trained registered nurses evaluate health, screen for potential complications, answer questions, and address any unexpected changes families are experiencing during the first two weeks after delivery.
- Nurses will connect families to community resources based on their specific circumstances.

\*While the program will initially be limited to select counties, it will gradually expand service to additional NJ counties.



#### **Community Doulas**

Community doulas are a vital advocate during pregnancy who can help ensure a healthy pregnancy and support new parents during the postpartum phase.

The **Community of Caring** empowers communities and new parents by working with community partners to implement community doula training and free doula services in Paterson and the Greater Newark areas. This program expands access to doula care and provides free community doula training following the HealthConnect One program, which is recognized by the State of New Jersey.

- Doulas are trained to give emotional, physical, and informational care during pregnancy, childbirth, and the postpartum period.
- Doulas are members of your community who can be trusted to advocate for your needs.
- Doulas are respected members of the pregnancy care team, providing advocacy and support to parents.
- Doulas help improve birth outcomes and breastfeeding rates, setting up your family for success.

### Information for Doulas Interested in Enrolling as NJ FamilyCare Providers

Under NJ FamilyCare, doula services will be delivered by providers with community doula training from an approved training program.

Doulas must enroll to become a provider for NJ FamilyCare members. The first step in this process is to complete an application to become a "fee-for-service" provider within NJ FamilyCare. For a detailed guide on how to complete these first steps, please click <a href="here">here</a>.
