



If you have / leftover paint: \



- B DON'T
- Save it for touchups or use it as a base coat on a wall
- Give it to a neighbor, church, community theater, or other group
- DO NOT dump wet paint onto the ground
- DO NOT dump paint in or near a storm drain. Paint is harmful to fish and other wildlife!
- Do NOT put wet paint in the garbage

can safely be put in the garbage for disposal, as long as the paint is dry or solidified first. See next page for further instruction.



With small amounts (1 inch or less in the can)

- Remove lid and let the paint dry out in a well-ventilated area
- When completely dry, put the can in the garbage

Leave the lid off so your garbage collector will see that the paint is dry

If there is too much paint in the can to dry out

- Make sure the paint can is 1/2 full or less. Pour excess into another container, like a milk jug or coffee can
- until the can and/or containers are 3/4 full Add clay-based cat litter
- Stir the paint mixture until very thick. If the paint is still runny after 10 minutes, add more cat litter



- Let mixture dry in a well-ventilated area, away from kids and pets. It will take about one day for the mixture to harden
- When the mixture is solid and no longer runny, put the paint can in the garbage

Leave the lid off so your garbage collector will see that the paint is dry
